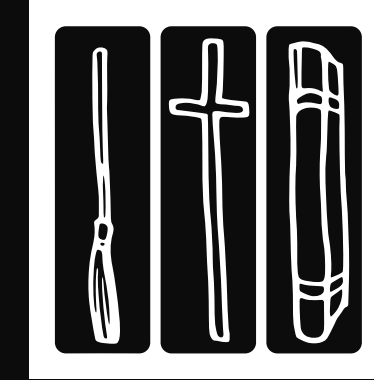

EVACUATION

Up to 80 places were arranged in the Martin Center for the temporary accommodation of all people who fled the war, in particular, from the north of the Kyiv region (Hostomel', Borodyanka, Bucha, Vorzel) Chernihiv.

The main task in the first weeks of the war was to save the children who were under our care, especially the youngest, children with disabilities and their families, because they have limited mobility. The next step was assistance for Mykolaiv, Kryvyi Rih, Mariupol and other cities of the South and East of the country.

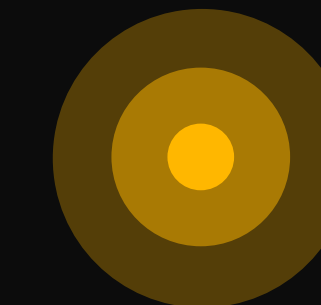

RECONSTRUCTION

KYIV REGION

At the end of March, the Kyiv region was liberated. After demining the road, we went to Makariv district.

For the first time, we saw destruction, burned tanks on the roads, frightened people who had not seen bread for a month and needed emergency aid, roofing film, window coverings, emergency repairs, gas cylinders for cooking, tools.

CHICKS

When we were in the villages near Borodyanka, we met people who wanted to restore their houses and plant homesteads after the Russian occupation. This gives hope for the victory of life over death!

The occupiers lived in the house of a woman from the village of Andriivka for more than a month (there were 3 Russian tanks in her yard). They ate absolutely everything they could. She complained a lot that now she had nothing, she was especially worried that there were no chickens... That is why we decided to provide psychological support to the residents of the villages of the Kyiv region to restore their emotional state. And there is nothing better than returning to normal life.



With the support of our partners Zupa na Monciaku from Gdańsk, we bought 2,000 chickens, and they brought more than 7,500 different seeds from Poland. What was the joy of the people, that life returns.

MODULES

Many people were left without a roof over their heads and could not return to their own areas, thanks to the support of the Office of the Prime Minister of Poland, we managed to install 21 residential modules for living.

For many people, it was a new beginning. In just a few months, the residents completed the rooms and kitchens, so the modules became full-fledged housing.

EVENTS FOR CHILDREN

The children who remained in the Kyiv region needed emergency psychological help, one of the forms of therapy is the integration of joint cultural and entertainment activities.





In the summer, we visited the de-occupied areas of the Kyiv region: Borodyanka, Makariv, Zahal'tsi, Nova Buda and organized a Children's Day celebration, where whole families came to enjoy delicious burgers, hot dogs, and ice cream.

In autumn, we combined a treat from our San Angelo coffee shop with the distribution of school supplies in the villages of Zahal'tsi, Andriivka, Novyi Korohod, Nalyvaivka, Pochepyn. And at the celebration of St. Nicholas Day, the gifts to the children of Fastiv district, Kherson region, and Chernihiv region were given.

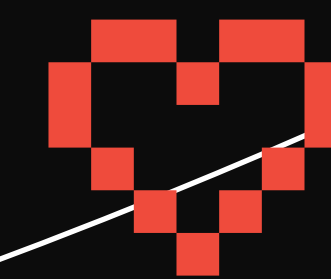

FOOD AND CLOTHING

From the first days of the war, in Fastiv, as in many cities, there was a lack of basic necessities. This most affected the elderly and large families. It was also a challenge for us, especially when we received reports that people were starving in nursing homes. We began to organize ongoing assistance that continues to this day.

Of course, the trajectory changes. At the beginning, it was Kyiv region and Chernihiv region, and now - Kharkiv region, Kherson region and targeted assistance for the needy, as well as for forcibly displaced persons.

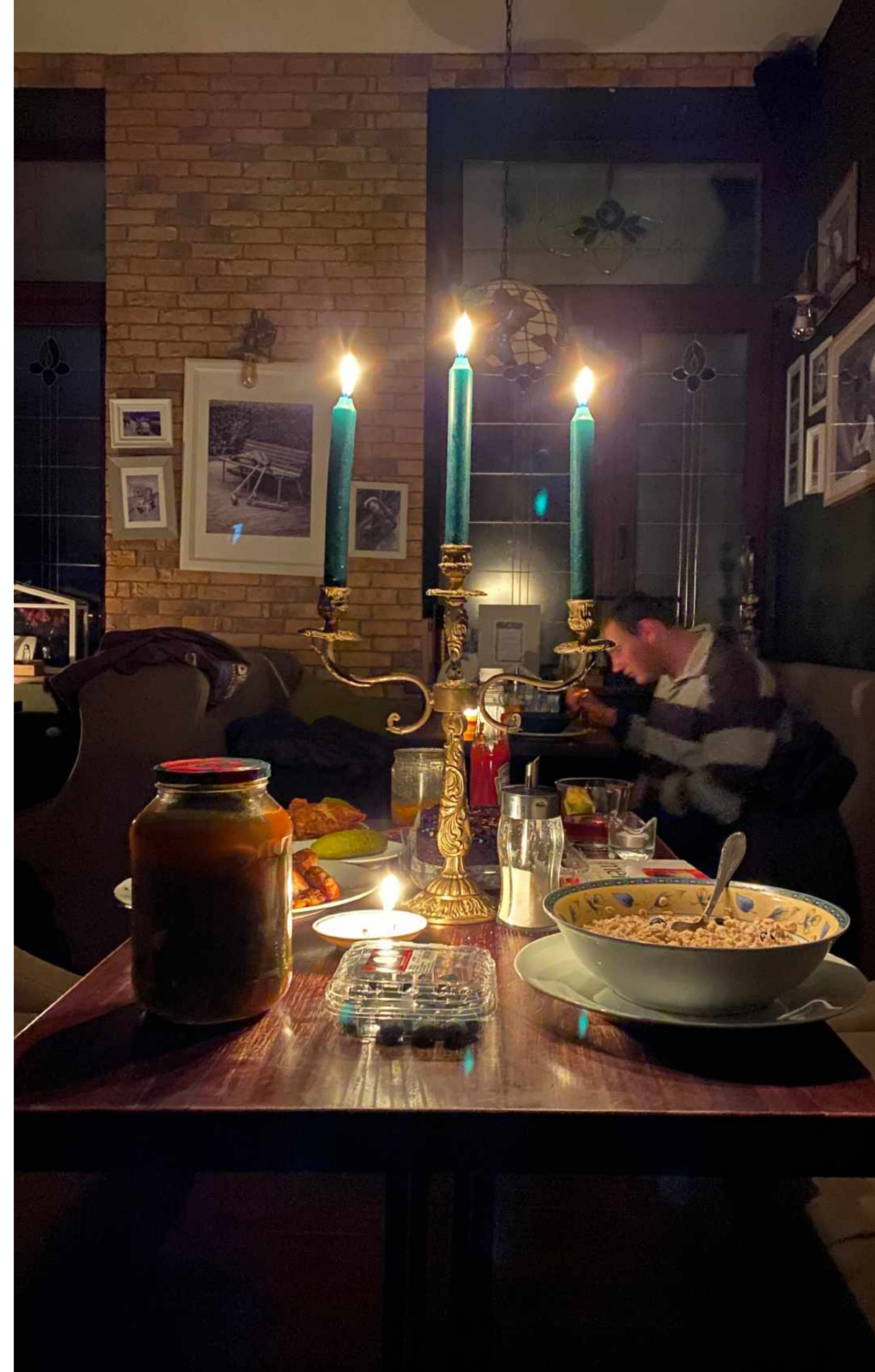

Our Center has had more than 120 volunteers over the past year, and many of them remain with us to this day from Ukraine and abroad.



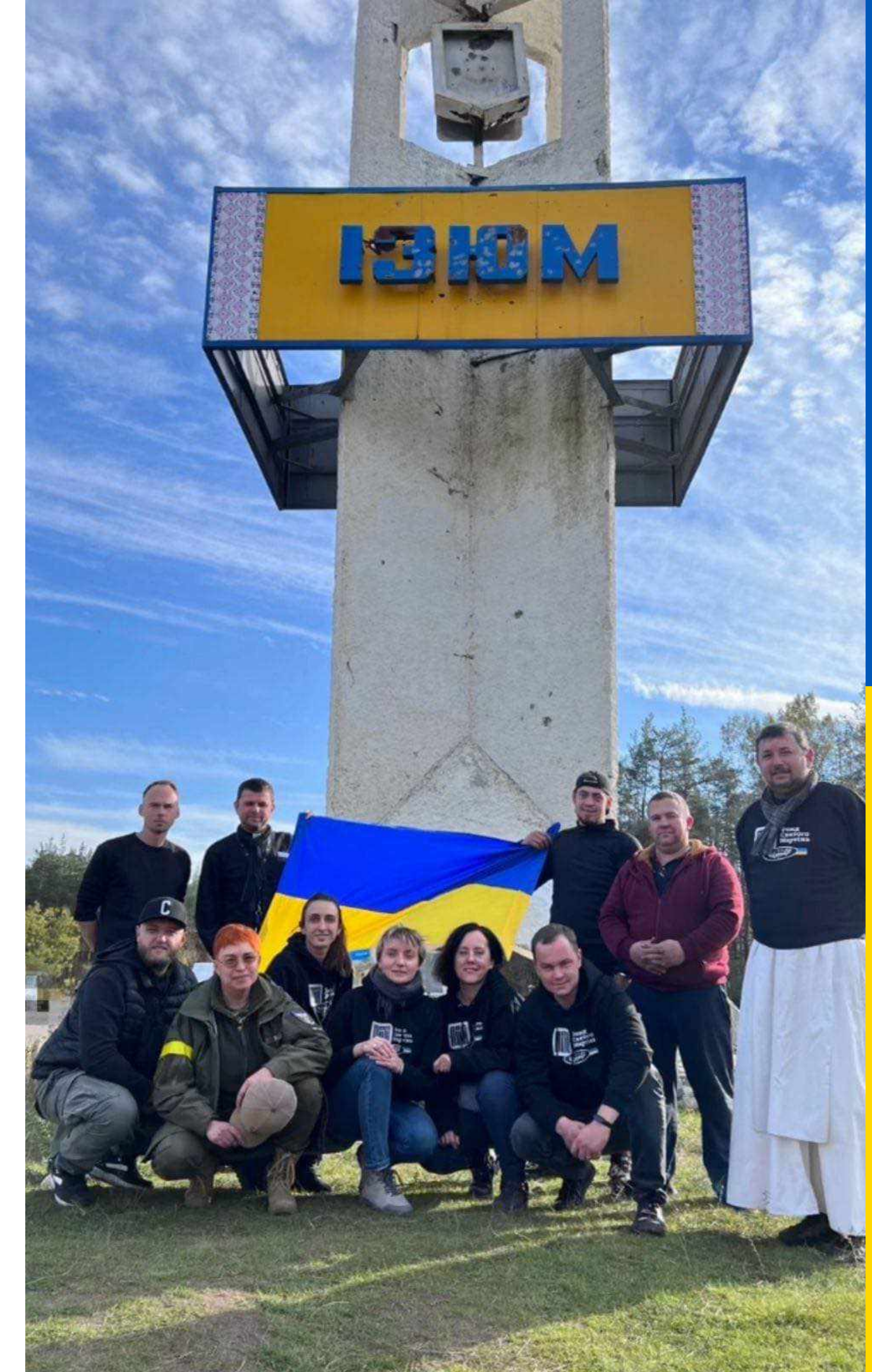

Since October, our geographic mission has expanded to Kharkiv region, and from November to Kherson region.

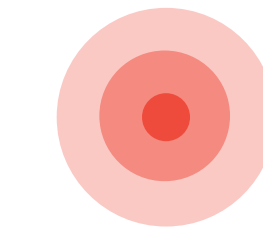

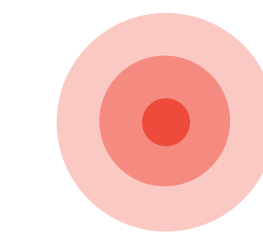

From the first day of the full-scale war, our friends and acquaintances went to defend our country. We immediately, if possible, closed requests that were aimed at the safety of our soldiers. Medicines for military hospitals and units, construction materials, chemical heaters, and sleeping bags were also an important element.

The most important thing for our defenders is the realization that they are remembered and cared for.

HELP IN COLD WEATHER

In October 2022, under our unit in the Kharkiv region, we brought blankets and pillows to the liberated Balakliya for people who had been under occupation since March and had lost their warm clothes due to moisture and mold. This was the first need.

But there was also an urgent need to provide the victims with generators, alternative stoves, firewood, gas cylinders and burners.

SHELTER

Whenever we are struggling, we look for people who will understand us, won't ask us unnecessary difficult questions and will accept us as we are.

The war forced mothers and children to flee from danger, so the project of a social house on the Kyivska St, 57 was partially transformed in order to create a Shelter for war victims as soon as possible.

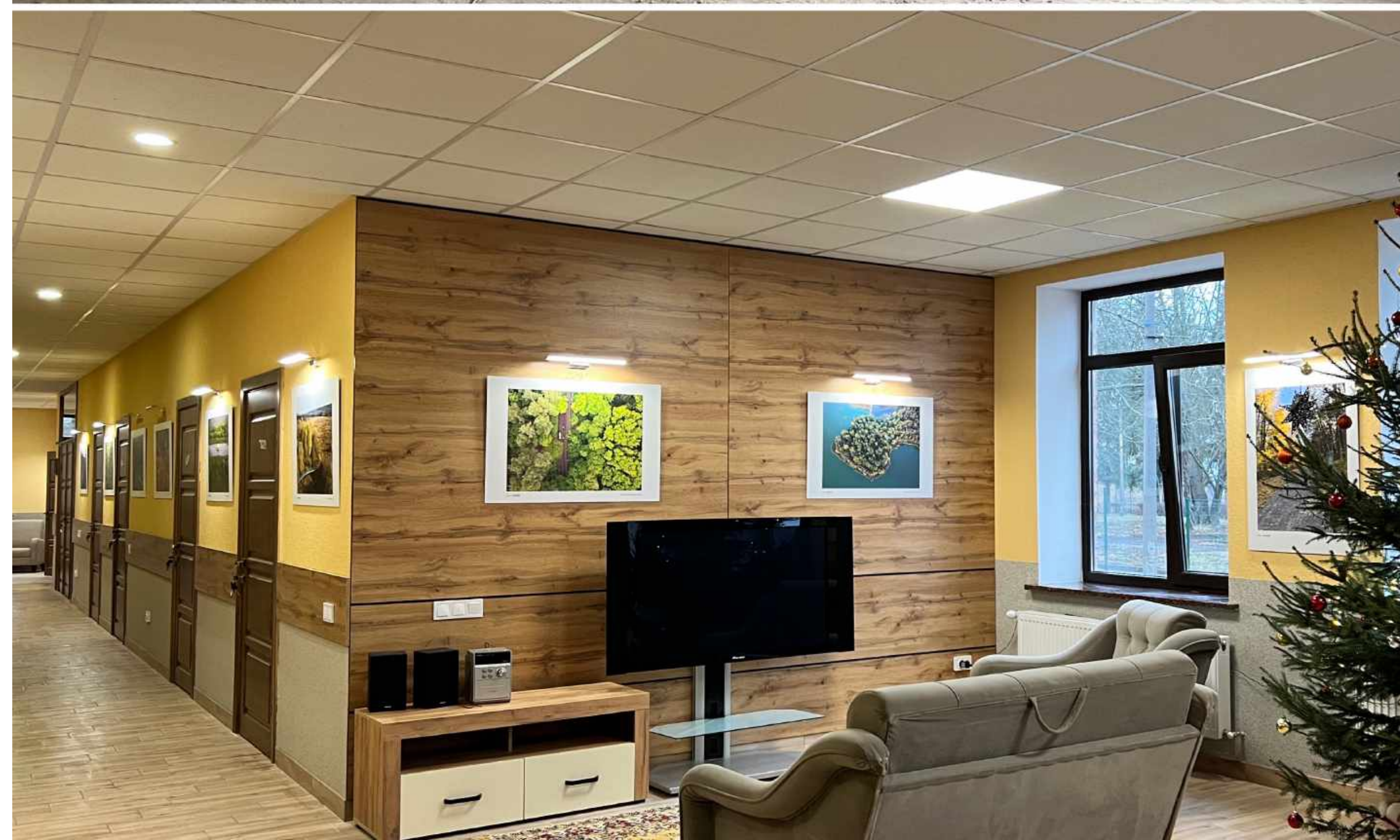

Capital repair works lasted 2 years. In a very short time, on January 6, 2023, the shelter was consecrated and opened. Currently, 26 people live there, including 16 children aged 10 months to 17 years from Melitopol, Zaporizhzhia, Bakhmut, Kherson, Pokrovsk, Kyiv, Kharkiv, Severodonetsk.

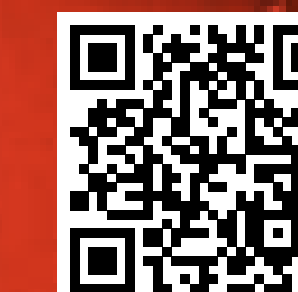
Residents receive comprehensive psychological, medical and social rehabilitation in addition to the shelter of supportive housing services.

SCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN

74 children receive educational and patronage services at St. Martin's Catholic School.

39 children are fully supported by the charity fund.

In addition to a full-fledged state curriculum, our children learn the Polish language and receive a virtuous Christian upbringing. In response to numerous requests, for 2 years in a row, we have been conducting patronage support for children on distance education. This year there are 10 children aged 12-14, 14 children with special educational needs.





Children aged 2.6-6 years old are among the smallest in the Development Space, this year there are 44 children, 8 of them are children with special educational needs. Despite the constant warnings about missile threats, we support children in their growth, enveloping them with love and care.

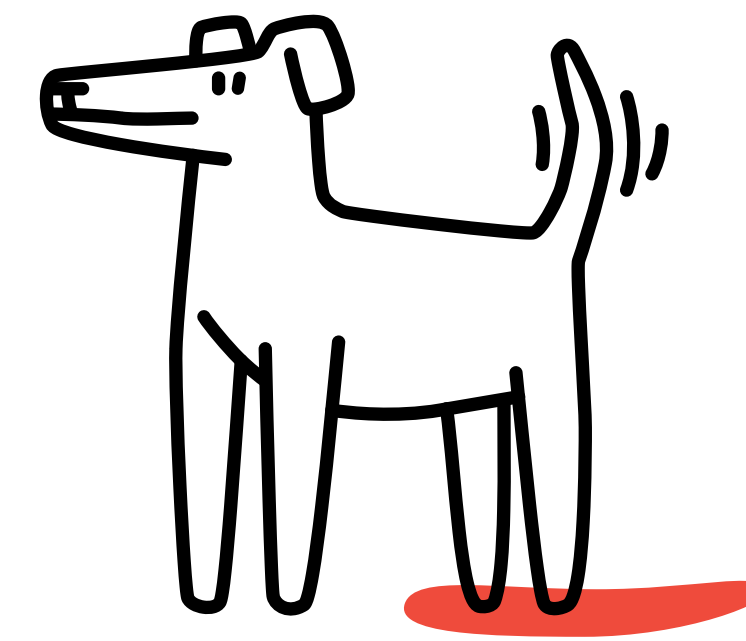
THE STORY ABOUT THE DOG MASHKA, WHICH SAVED 12 LIVES

On May 27, 2022, we held a charity event for the residents of the village in Borodyanka. Our volunteers and the team of the "San Angelo" coffee shop prepared burgers and hot dogs. Unfortunately, the consequences of what happened affected many people. Sadness, irritability, to some extent bitterness.

A woman with three dogs stopped near our food truck.

She was dressed in a winter jacket, people looked askance at her, she did not have the courage to come up and stand in the general queue.

An acquaintance with whom I spoke told me: "This is our local fool."
I asked why, to which I received the following answer: "Together with her dogs, she saved 12 lives."



And the following story was told by the woman herself, after she received 3 hot dogs and delicious coffee. And coffee, as she said, should be without sugar, because sugar is not coffee.

"The first days of March were very scary. The central street of Borodyanka was completely destroyed. It was after March 8. I was walking down that street with a cart and dogs, and one of my dogs, Mashka, grabbed my pants and dragged me growling towards the collapsed house. I told the dog that I was thinking about her, using the appropriate vocabulary, but Mashka did not give in, barking, she continued to pull me in the same direction. After such a struggle, we reached the remains of the 9th floor.



The dog ran ahead and barked in a very specific place. Out of curiosity, I approached, leaned down and heard voices from below. "We have been here for 6 days, we lack food and water, help," I heard from under the rubble. "Later, this dog found four more people in another house."

During the occupation, no one particularly touched this woman. She walked with dogs and a cart in which she had water and food. When the occupiers asked what she was doing, she always said that she was feeding the dogs. And in this way, for the next weeks, she ate and fed people under the rubble.



As part of the research, Save Pets of Ukraine conducted a census of 510 shelters, sterilization centers and animal volunteers who take care of abandoned animals. According to animal rights activists, as of January 2023, 25,799 dogs and 19,473 cats are under the care of shelters and volunteers of the St. Martin Foundation.
